

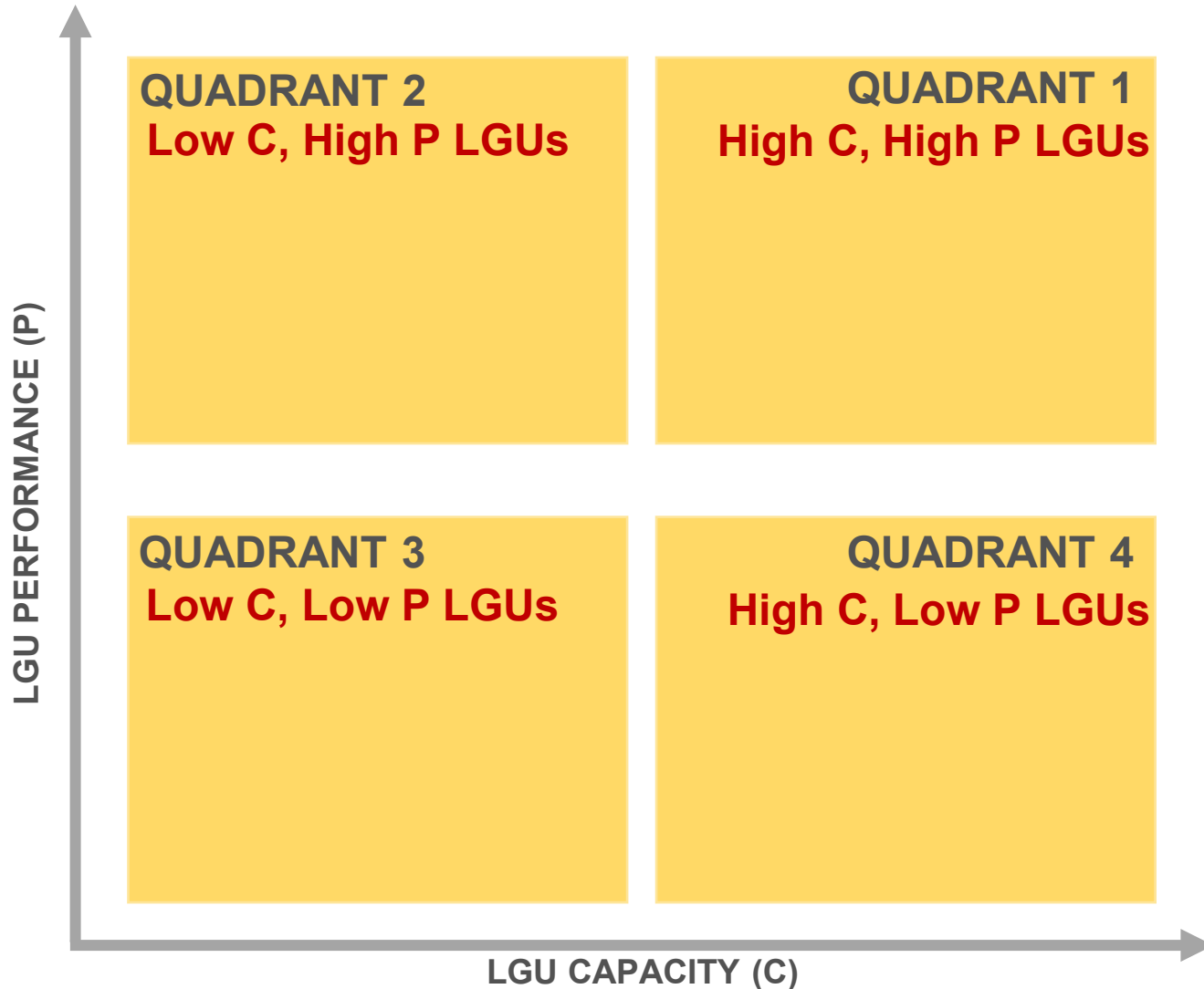

The Capacity-Performance Quadrant



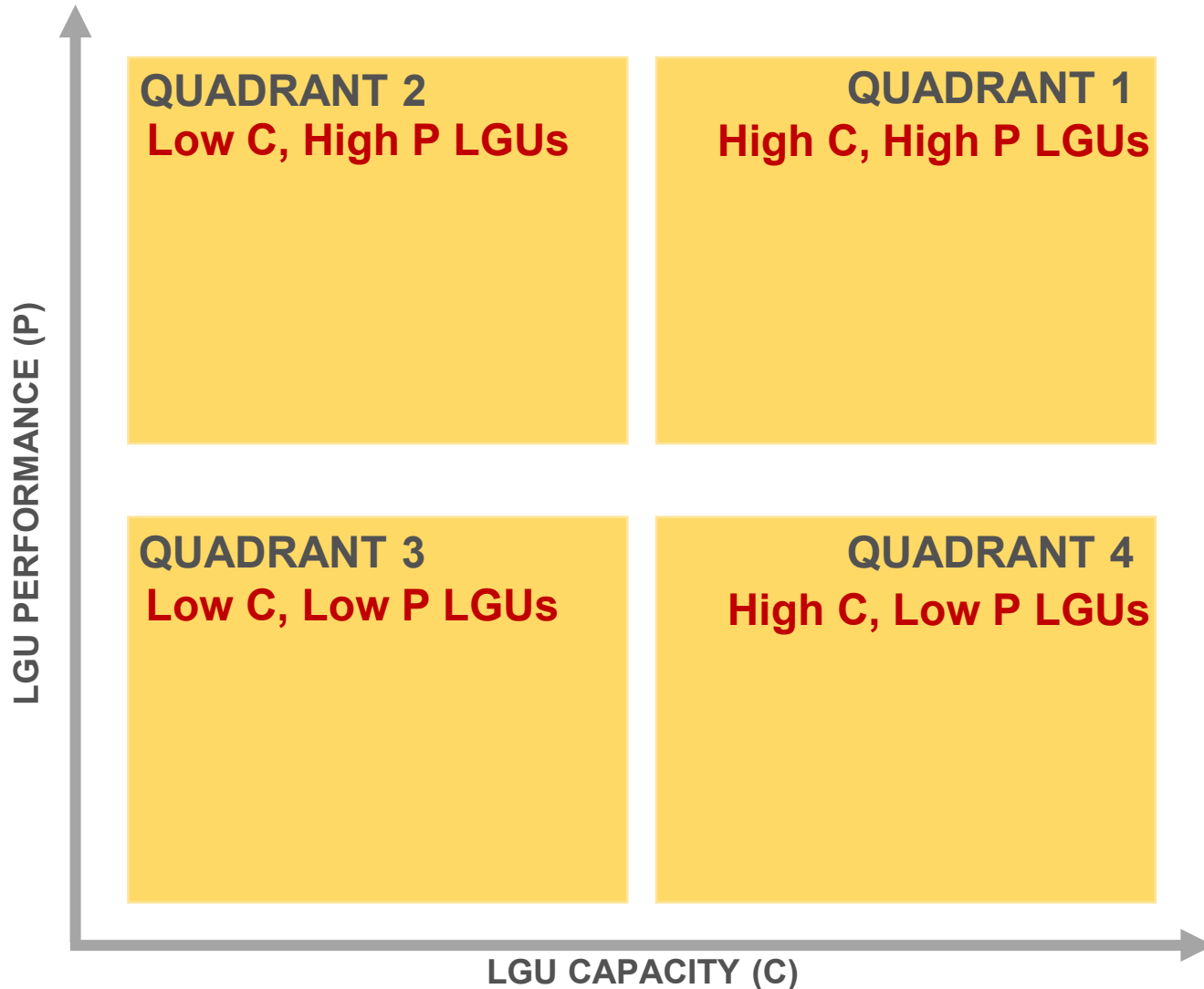
Q1: EVOLVE – into sources of good practice and innovation, and exemplars of local governance under full devolution

Q2: ENABLE – to unlock capacity issues to seize in full the promises of full devolution and reinforce performance as a result of targeted CapDev solutions

Q3: ENGAGE – to catch up with other LGUs, and provide them with targeted CapDev solutions

Q4: ENERGIZE – to translate this into high performance in the context of full devolution through targeted CapDev solutions

The Capacity-Performance Quadrant



Utilizing the Capacity-Performance Quadrant by:

1. Thoroughly **analyzing the direction of local government units (LGUs)** so as to determine the appropriate interventions given its performance and capacity;
2. Proposal and implementation of solutions and interventions through **appropriate legislative action**; and,
3. Creating **results** that improve the performance and capacity of the LGUs



Ensuring Food Security and Nutrition LGU Participation in the KADIWA ng Pangulo

DILG Memorandum Circular 2024-003

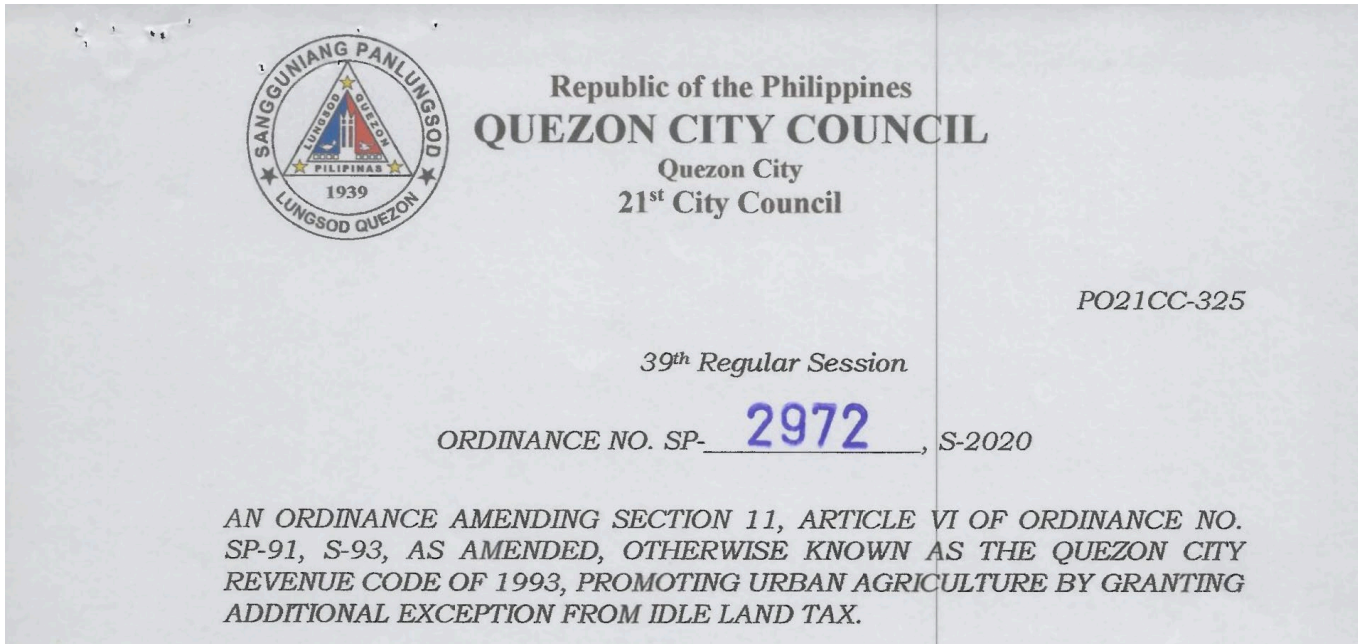

Localizing the KADIWA Program

LGUs have started to establish their respective KADIWA centers in their localities.

For example, in Tuguegarao City, a KADIWA Center was set-up by the LGU in coordination with 20 micro MSMEs, 4H Club members, Rural Improvement Clubs (RICs), and City Agriculture and Fishery Councils

Ensuring Food Security and Nutrition Quezon City's Urban Farms



Local Legislative Action:

Quezon City's Sangguniang Panlalawigan passed **SP 2972 s. 2020** which exempts idle properties from idle land tax if they are used for **urban agriculture**, provided that it is utilized for such purpose for more than three (3) years.

Agricultural produce yielded from these lands can be for personal or public consumption.

Result:

More than 1,026 urban farms were established in Quezon City in December 2023, a rise from 754 from the start of the year. 25,000 resident urban farmers working in green jobs also benefited from the program

- Galing Pook 2023 Awardee
- Initiative to **strengthen health leadership at the barangay level** through recognition and incentive
- Performance indicators and targets which aim to address malnutrition, maternal death, poor sanitation, infectious diseases, etc.
- Led to substantial decrease in the malnutrition rate, from **19%-20%** in 2022-2014 to **1.3%** in 2022, among other improvements.

Result:

Despite being a relatively small town, Anao, Tarlac was given recognized during the 2023 Kwentong Tagumpay for their commendable performance as a water utilities body.

Local Legislative Action:

In an effort to "guide, control, and regulate the development of the Municipality's water supply system," the Municipality of Anao, Tarlac passed **Resolution No. 2009-007**, which further systematizes the operation and management of the the water system.

Supporting Enhanced Water Supply and Sanitation Official Launch of the SAFPB Program in Cebu City



Among the aims of the **Support and Assistance Fund to Participatory Budgeting (SAFPB)**, which was launched last February 21, 2024 in Cebu City, is to further and accelerate the provision of access to safe, sufficient, and improved water supply to LGUs.

The SAFPB will provide **seventy-five (75) LGUs** across the country with **PHP 13 million** to achieve this goal.

Ensuring Peace and Order Protecting Communities from Fire



One hundred and twenty-three (123) local government units will be provided with a **firetruck and fire station** by the end of the year, ensuring that all LGUs across the country will have the necessary equipment and facilities to fight-off fires.

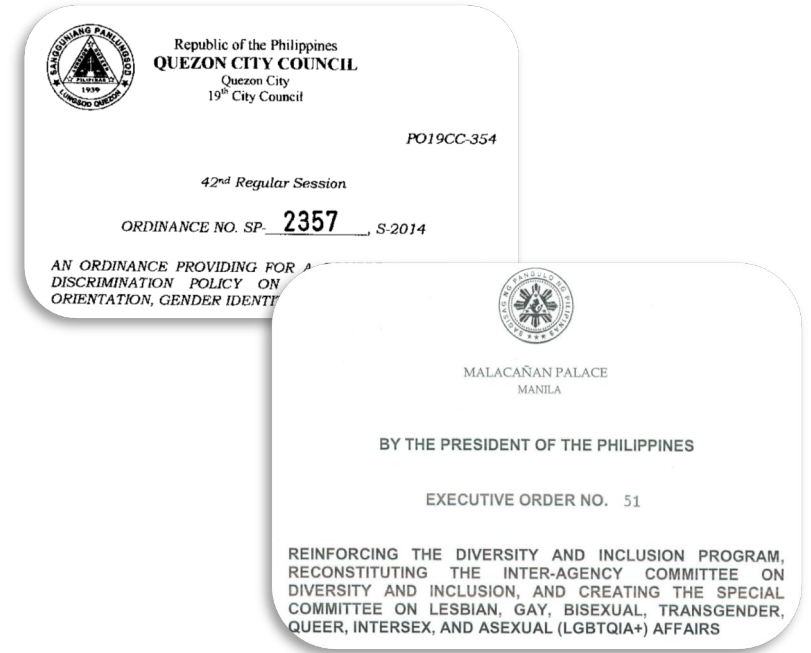
National Youth Convention 2023

Raising public awareness on **gender based violence (GBV)** and fostering conversations on issues related to violence against women (VAW)



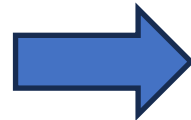

Utilizing the Capacity-Performance Quadrant towards Legislative Action and Development of Human Capital

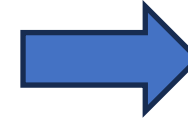
Analysis
